Graham Hall	Mr. Earle E. Graham	Teacher of Agronomy/Animal Industry, 1919-27, Vice President 1927-55, Academic Dean 1932-58, and Vice President Emeritus 1958-76
Greene Hall	Mr. Lake A. Greene	Physical Plant Engineer 1943-63
Harrod Hall	Mrs. Margie Jones Harrod	Counselor of Women, 1951-54, Director of Student Activities, 1954-63, Dean of Women, 1954-67
Jackson Hall	Mrs. Laura Jackson	First matron for the school serving from its opening, 1910-22
Magale Library	John F. and Joanna Magale	Established an endowment fund in excess of \$500,000 in cash and securities plus oil interest, which have increased the fund to more than \$1,000,000 for the purchase of books and library.
